The Kingdom

In the gospels we read of Jesus preparing people for the coming of a Kingdom. He calls it the Kingdom of God. Matthew, writing to the Jews primarily, uses the phrase 'Kingdom of Heaven' in reference to it. You have likely read that phrase many times yet do you know what it is? What does it look like? What are its features? How is it governed? What are the rules? How does one come to live there? Does it cost anything to live there?

It is mysterious to be sure but the Bible sure has a lot to say about it. It can be gained and it can be lost. It is of great value. It can be entered but only by those who are properly prepared. God has promised it to believers. He expects them to proclaim it and they will one day inherit it. That kind of seems like something we ought to know about doesn't it?

This year we will be on an adventure of discovery about the Kingdom of God. All of the sermon series this year will have a kingdom focus. My hope is that we will all have a better understanding of what the Kingdom of God is, of what it is about and of what it is to live in that Kingdom during our time on earth.

The first of the Kingdom series is called "Kingdom Beginnings" and it is on the book of Exodus. We'll see how God first set up His kingdom and gain perspective on what it looked like to live in it out in the wilderness.

The second series will be called "Kingdom Family." We will learn that the basic building block of the Kingdom is the family. We will discuss the role each of us play in growing and calling others into this Kingdom.

The third series (Summer 2019) will be called "The Kingdom of God." In this one we will focus on the kingdoms of David and Solomon and look into how the united kingdom of Israel mirrors the Kingdom of God in which Christ reigns.

We will close "The Kingdom" theme with a series called "Kingdom Mind." In it we will look at Romans chapter 12 and see what our minds should be as they are renewed in the transformation that comes through the blood of Christ.

I am excited to see where God leads us through this year and how our discoveries about His glorious Kingdom will help us to be on our mission of living Kingdom lives and calling others into this amazing Kingdom of God.
