### A Sunrise Is A Beautiful Thing

*There are a number of important but messy political issues swirling around in our community of late. The issues are difficult with sides drawn up and acrimony expressed. For many the right path is unclear, the facts are muddy, and most commentary on information regarding the issues has a spin to it. Christians in the community see a moral angle to some of these issues. They see opportunities for dubious gain and fear wading into an ethical swamp where the deep holes are hidden and can swallow people whole. Where spiritual darkness exists, people of light will have their impact.*

*In the Bible, in the Old Testament book of Exodus, chapter three there is a story about Moses and his encounter with a bush that appeared to be on fire yet the fire did not consume the plant. I find that interesting, don't you? The fire that represented the spirit of God put off light but did no damage. We see a similar thing happen when the Holy Spirit first came to Jesus' followers in Acts chapter 2. What appeared to be fire settled on each individual but did not burn them. I think it is consistent with other encounters with the Spirit of God that it has great impact, it sheds light, it convicts, it offends but it is almost always gentle.*

*Jesus was God in the flesh in his time on earth. He was the essence of gentleness and grace. With the rare exceptions of driving the corrupt money exchangers out of the temple (in which he harmed no one) and the occasional confrontation with the Pharisees, Jesus is depicted as kind, loving and gentle. Even in the turbulent political environment of his time, Jesus rarely commented directly on political issues and seldom entered the fray on religious controversy and even when he did he either shut down an argument or walked away before it escalated.*

*In our world, when light confronts darkness it is usually a gradual take over. It is soft and gentle like the sun coming over a hill to slowly change a dark, foggy valley over to a bright landscape with color and movement. It is gentle, it is welcoming, it damages nothing except that which will not bear its effect. Those will always retreat.*

*I have no issue with Christians engaging in political commentary, offering godly feedback and opinion where appropriate. However, I find it off putting and even damaging to the Christian witness when the loudest, angriest and most aggressive voices speaking to an issue are those of believers. Our influence should be seen like the light of an oncoming dawn. It should be gentle, up building and encouraging even to those who oppose. It should find positives in persons while indicating negatives and evil, in actions or in plans. In 2 Corinthians 10:3, Paul says, "For though we live in the world, we do not wage war as the world does."*

*When Christians speak the words of God our voice will be heard as a brilliant fire but our impact will be gentle, not consuming the bush. In these challenging times, be gentle, be light. A sunrise is a beautiful thing.*
