The Elephant in the Room for Abortion

The abortion debate is picking up again. The state of New York announced that they now approve of performing abortions right up to the time the baby is born. It seems to them the question is no longer whether the unborn is considered life but merely a function of whether he or she is wanted. An honest consideration of the issue of life vs. choice reveals that it was never about the issue of when life begins. It has always been a matter of moral relativity, sexual license and economics.

There is little question about the morality of abortion. It would never stand a test of morality if the standard of morality was rooted in God or even just in something beyond the self. Moral relativity leaves the judgement about what is moral and what is immoral to the individual not to a community or corporate standard. The individual raises or lowers the bar based on personal knowledge, personal experience and the laws of the land. Moral relativity is a swamp that gives birth to greatly diverging perspectives on issues of cultural importance and dumps them in the lap of politicians and legislators who clamor for public support and try to ride the waves of popularity to remain in and advance to desired offices.

The issue of abortion is and has always been a companion to a cultural acceptance of and obsession for sexual liberty. As the Victorian shackles around sexual activity have relaxed, the pendulum has swung far to the other side of the cultural perspective. Whereas sex was at one time viewed as shameful and dirty even in a validated context, it is now viewed as permissible and even encouraged in nearly any context imaginable and anywhere it continues to be taboo, there is political momentum to release it to freedom from those confines as well.

In our culture, sex is viewed as entertainment. Sexual activity between consenting adults (even that current cultural standard is slipping) is thought to be "good, clean fun." As long as sexual activity is regarded as entertainment and relegated to the shallow end of the relational experience, there can be no real expectation for a change in the view of abortion. As long as children are regarded as a part of the acceptable risk and expense of our entertainment, the same moral swamp out of which comes sexual liberty will justify abortion and continue to push the limits outward.

The real elephant in the room in the abortion discussion is economics. When sex is entertainment and moral standards are set to the lowest common denominator, the consequences of our choices will continue to mount. A culture where marriage is rare and children are the responsibility of the mom and her family, has broken out of the impoverished inner city community and the rural poor community and is becoming more and more a mainstream reality. The burden of neglected, unwanted and poorly resourced children is falling more and more to the state. The birth rate of which this cultural shift is capable is staggering. The economic burden to the state is increasing steadily and states like New York are coming to the awareness that they simply can't keep up.

The answer to this mess is of course to embrace the creator's intent for sex and marriage and to continue to lovingly promote a godly sexual ethic, passing it down to our children. The abortion mess has no easy answers. We should be prepared for the fix to require dedication over generations.
