The Hispanic-Latino naming dispute is an ongoing disagreement over the use of the "Hispanic" and "Latino" to refer collectively to the inhabitants of the United States who are of Latin American or Spanish origin—that is, Latino or Hispanic Americans. The usage of both terms has changed to adapt to a wide range of geographical and historical influences. The term "Hispanic" was used first; later, some Hispanics in the western United States came to prefer the term "Latino". The Census does not classify persons of Portuguese or Brazilian descent as Hispanic, as those are Portuguese-speaking populations. According to a 2011 study by the Pew Research Center, the majority (51%) of Hispanic and Latino Americans prefer to identify with their families' country of origin, while only 24% prefer the terms "Hispanic" or "Latino". (Google, Wikipedia) So, Latino is use to identify those born in the U.S. but of parents of any Latin America country. Hispano will usually be used by any person in other countries like Mexico, Central America or South America (except in Brazil, or Guyanas)... Very interesting....
