Caesar Augustus was the first emperor of Rome. He held that position after the assassination of his uncle, Julius Caesar in 44 BC and after the Senate named him as their supreme leader in 27 BC. He remained so until his death in AD 14. Secular history holds him to be among the best of the emperors of Rome. He also spread the empire out to its farthest reach and devised a system for taxing the peoples he ruled over. He also was successful in squelching all open conflict within the empire so that the wars of expansion were the sole focus of the famous Roman military. The iron fist with which he covered the empire was a peace keeping force of military detachments in every province and territory he ruled. He called this peace "Pax Romana" or Roman Peace. It basically meant that provinces and territories which had previously been independent states were not to have a military or use armed force to attack Roman forces or neighboring peoples. Put bluntly it meant "live peacefully or die violently." Crucifixion was one of the ways devised to enforce Pax Romana and it was used with great effectiveness...with at least one notable exception.

It was both ironic and providential that Jesus was born during such a time. It was Augustus who ordered the census that required Jesus' parents to be in Bethlehem at the time of his birth. It was Pax Romana that allowed Jesus' parents to take him safely to Egypt when threatened by the edict of Herod. God was at work through the metanarrative of the powerful Roman Empire, a force which the world had not known before nor since, to bring about the seemingly smaller story of a little baby born in a sleepy town on an otherwise ordinary night.

The child born that night would grow up to lead a movement that would change the world. The story of the Roman Empire would eventually pale in comparison to the story of the followers of the little baby boy. It was beyond unlikely that the baby in Mary's lap would one day lead a group of followers who would take his message all over the Empire of Rome; something that could only have been accomplished under Pax Romana. Roman Emperors would later try to squash the spread of Christianity but could only succeed in being a catalyst for its explosive growth.

The child born that night, the one Herod tried to have killed, the one Pilate condemned to death, whose followers would burn on poles as torches to light the garden of a later emperor named Nero, and whose followers yet another emperor, Domitian, would have torn apart by wild animals in the arena before crowds of cheering onlookers; that same child, named Jesus would be the one proclaimed by leaders of that same Empire as Lord and Christ. How amazing that one so small would lead a revolution at the pleasure of God that would one day take over the greatest Empire in the history of mankind and subdue it. What Augustus knew as the Empire of Rome would one day be called the Holy Roman Empire. His idea of Pax Romana literally paved the way for the revolution.

The Christ child would lead a revolution in the time of Pax Romana, or Roman peace to bring peace to the world. He would be called the Prince of Peace. His peace would be a real peace, a "peace that surpasses understanding." We can read about Pax Romana in our history books but we can still have the peace of Jesus in our hearts.

May the peace of Christ be with you always.
