Jesus' Prayer for Unity: An Impossible Dream?

Early in the fourth century AD, the Christian church had just emerged from a time of intense persecution and in a few short years was first given reprieve, then recognition, then power in Rome. For those who lived through the transition, it must have been as surreal as it gets.

With new found freedom, the leaders of the Christian church began to establish communication among the groups of Christians that had scattered all over the empire. What they found Christians, still passionate for God's mission but in some cases, without guidance from more mature believers had embraced doctrinal elements that were not supported by early apostolic writers. They called it false doctrine and heresy.

The church leaders went about trying to correct the false doctrine that had been propagated during the time of persecution. They attempted to standardize a doctrine for the whole church so that churches and their leaders would be unified around a core of doctrine that reflected the core of first century apostolic and second century church father writings.

One of the dubious teachers that had gained a lot of followers in that time was a man named Arius. Arius held a less traditional view of the trinity. He believed that God was a supreme deity and Jesus was separate from and subordinate to Him. Church tradition as well as many of the leading experts in the church at that time believed that Jesus and God were equal, one and the same. They felt suggesting that Jesus was a lesser deity or figure was both blasphemy and heresy. They called church leaders from all over the civilized world at the time to gather in Nicaea to a church council where they would discuss and settle controversial issues and standardize doctrine and beliefs of the church. Arius and his followers defended their teachings before the council but were eventually voted down by decree of the emperor and banished from Christian fellowship. Arius died shortly thereafter.

For roughly 1200 years after the Council of Nicaea, Christianity was held together by edict of the church leadership. The highest levels of church leadership set the standards for doctrine and practice and everyone who called themselves Christian were forced to comply. Sanctions, punishment and even death rained down upon any who dared challenge the authority of the Pope. It was a kind of unity to be sure but doesn't seem to be the kind Jesus asked for in his prayer in John 17, "that they may be one as we (Jesus and God) are one" (v. 22).

After the Lutheran Reformation, the church was fragmented once the force that held them together was taken away. It remains horribly fragmented today.

Doesn't it strike you as odd that most Christians today seem fine with the fact that Jesus' followers remain in a state of disunity? From his words in John 17, it doesn't feel like Jesus considers unity optional or "only if it's convenient," yet here we are looking awkwardly around, waiting for someone to do something.

I personally believe that the unity for which our Lord prayed is possible. It's going to require facing fears, changing attitudes and tearing down walls. It can be done but it has to start with us. It starts with prayer; prayer that God will move in a big way to bring us together and that hearts will be open when he does. I hope my eyes see the days when God moves to bring his people together again to be one.
