Worship in the Storm

"How are you?" That used to be a question that we considered a courtesy. We answered "Fine, and you?" They answered "good" and we went on with whatever we were doing. In 2021, we have had to consider the context of the question. "You mean in the context of the pandemic or the weather or politics or some other nightmarish misfortune?" Storms have been raging. There have been many storms over the past year and most of them have had nothing to do with weather.

Folks have been through the wringer. We are living in times that are unprecedented in the memories of most people now living. This pandemic has most of us feeling lonely. We are missing our people! We lack motivation. Our passion is waning. Our personal productivity is down. Then on top of that add the stress of the last election and the political turmoil that continues ad nauseum. Then last week we had the largest winter storm of the past 30 years (at least) blow through messing up travel, taking out power and plunging temperatures to record lows. Whew! Enough already!

Through all of this, our prayers are that the God who loves us will make our lives easy, keep our loved ones with us and smooth the way ahead so that nothing tragic or untoward will happen. Unfortunately, that is often not the way it goes. It takes no more than a quick read of the Bible to see that the great men and women of God had lives filled with trouble and tragedy but that is precisely what formed their faith.

Hebrews chapter 11 is the passage we like to call the "Hall of Faith." In it are references to several great characters of the Old Testament. They are men and women who fought through difficult times leaning on God to pull them through. In verse six of this chapter the author says, "And without faith it is impossible to please God." Anyone can say they have faith but it is true that an untested faith is no faith at all. The test is part of the journey. If we want a great faith, we must accept the tests.

Remember in Acts 16 when Paul and Silas were in a Philippian prison? They had been beaten and placed in jail with their feet in stocks. Their punishment was undeserved and mostly due to being Jews who ran afoul of Roman citizens in a Roman city. Scripture says that around midnight Paul and Silas were awake in their prison cell. They were unsure what would happen to them the next day. Yet with their freedom and their very lives at risk, they worshipped God. It could only be that they were men of mature faith because only believers of mature faith would know that worship was the way to cope with hardship. In worship, one does not ask God to resolve the situation in their favor. In worship one is accepting whatever outcome will most benefit the Kingdom. It was the same as Jesus' prayer, "not my will but yours be done."

It is tough when the storms are raging to accept negative, even tragic outcomes trusting that God's choice is the right one. However, when faith is tested it becomes more and more authentic and more dedicated to the will of God.

As the storms of late continue to rage, let us pray that whatever happens, it goes to God's glory even if it is not the outcome for which we hoped. Then worship. Worship the God who loves you. Worship the God who will be with you in the storm and walk beside you through it wherever His path leads.
