## A Spiritual Fit Bit

I have a friend who received one of those "Fit Bit" smart watches for a Christmas present. Along with keeping the time, these watches also help you keep up with your fitness goals. It follows and encourages work out routines, like running and walking and even helps keep track of dietary goals. It is a very useful gadget for the health conscious. Except, my friend really isn't that. She talks a good game but... well let's just say evidence seems to run to the contrary.

One day I witnessed her sitting at her desk, shaking her arm up and down. It seemed an odd ritual, so I asked, "What are you doing?" She grinned at me sheepishly and said, "I'm in a competition with a friend to see who can get the most steps in each week. I found that I can fool my Fit Bit into thinking I am exercising by doing this."

That is interesting isn't it? She buys technology to help measure fitness goals. Then she devises ways to deceive the technology into recording more exercise than she actually does. She boasts about meeting exercise goals that she really did not meet and goes forward with the outward appearance of striving for fitness while bearing the inward burden that the outward appearance is a false front.

Eventually, her deception will come clear as the obvious evidence of a long term, intentional fitness program (weight loss, increased stamina, increased strength, etc..) fails to materialize. People will suspect that something is amiss because evidence doesn't match up with the rhetoric.

Spirituality is that way as well. Christians are known to sometimes talk the talk about being like Jesus, being transformed by his presence, being convicted to becoming more holy and growing spiritually. However, when their lives fail to bear the obvious evidence of the fruit of the Spirit, something is up. When one claims to be a passionate follower of Jesus but in his or her life there is no evidence of becoming more loving, more joyful, more at peace, more patient, kinder, a better person, more faithful, more gentle, and more self-controlled, their claims of passion are not validated in the crucible of life. If someone can sit in church services for years and day to day, week to week still be the selfish husband, cranky mom, grumpy boss, or self-focused college student that they always have been then something is wrong. They may look good on the outside but when by themselves they are shaking their spiritual Fit Bit while refusing to allow the Spirit to do any real transformation in their lives.

Jesus' disciples were transformed from being culturally religious people to being passionate followers of the Lamb of God. They were ordinary men who became extraordinary because they allowed their time with Jesus to affect everything about them. They began with the hope that being around Jesus would elevate them to living in the palace of a king. By the end, they sacrificed themselves to bring his Kingdom to earth as it is in heaven. That is spiritual fervor. That is purpose and meaning. That is something to live and die for.

In Romans chapter twelve, Paul, one of the apostles, and a passionate follower of Jesus, encouraged his readers to "never lack in zeal but keep their spiritual fervor," (v. 11). Being passionate for self will never produce the kind of person God wants. Only passion for the Kingdom in abandon of self will produce within us the evidence that we are truly followers of the King.
