Worship, A Way of Life

Today (if you are reading this on Sunday) is a big day for those who enjoy professional football. It is Superbowl Sunday. This afternoon the Tampa Bay Buccaneers will take on the Kansas City Chiefs in a showdown to determine who will be remembered as the NFL champion for the year 2020. The Bucs have Tom Brady, a legendary quarterback, who brought them from being one of the worst teams in the league last year to within one game of being crowned the best team this year. The Chiefs have Patrick Mahomes, who is a younger quarterback but is already breaking records set by elite QB's when they were his age. Both teams have potent offenses and good defenses. It should be a great game with a lot of passing and high scores on both sides. It could be one of those games where the winner will be the team who scores as the time runs out.

If you are not into football and do not care about the Superbowl, you were bored with the preceding paragraph and hope I move on from football. I will but first let me ask you this question. What do you think the players who will be playing in this game did this past week? Do you think they spent a lot of time going to movies or parties? Did they hang out with the family a lot and drive kids to band practice? I'm going to guess no. I'm guessing the players are all focused on preparation for the game. For them, football isn't just a fun game to play. It is their passion not to mention their livelihood. They have been attending team meetings, working out, staying in top physical condition, practicing with their team and reviewing films of their upcoming opponent. For the last several months and especially for the last two weeks they have been eating, sleeping and breathing football. You might say that football has been their life.

In Romans chapter 12:1, The apostle Paul says something interesting about worship. He says, "Therefore, I urge you, brothers, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to God – this is your spiritual act of worship." The Greek word the apostle chose to use for worship referred to the kind of worship that the priests did as they offered sacrifices and did their work in the temple. It is a worship of service. It is performing spiritual acts in the presence of God. Paul is using the human body as a metaphor for both the temple of God and the sacrifice offered in the temple. He is telling his audience that their service before God was to take the sacrifice of their own bodies (lives) and offer it to God as worship.

Back in those days, a sacrifice did not just give some of themselves. The lamb could not just offer a leg or an ear. It was everything. In Paul's worship metaphor then, a Christian cannot just offer a part of him or herself to God. He wants everything laid on the altar before him as a sacrifice to be used for his purposes. That is worship.

This does not sound like something we might do in just an hour on Sunday. You cannot make your body a sacrifice to God that way any more than a football player can just show up for the game and expect to play. Christians need to shift the paradigm of Sunday morning "worship" to worship both in and out of the building. Everything we do is filled with service to God and intent on pleasing him. Worship as a sacrifice of service is much more than an hour on Sunday morning. It is a way of life.
