Go Means Me

I used to think that in order to obey the Great Commission you had to be a missionary. To answer the call of God you had to pack a suitcase and go somewhere far from home to tell people whom you don't know about Jesus. It was honestly how I understood my Bible class teachers as I grew up. It was probably a misunderstanding on my part but still, to me when the Bible said, "go," it meant go somewhere away from home.

To be fair, he probably did mean that for the apostles and disciples who came to see him off as he was whisked back into heaven. Most of them would find that their ministry began in Jerusalem but then took them to different parts of the world. They were intended to lead the movement of Jesus' church across the globe. Apparently, they did exactly that at least according to official church history. While some of the historical accounts of how the apostles died and where they are buried are not verified by outside records, they give us an idea of where the apostles might have been when they died. Several, according to church tradition, died and were buried in Rome, Italy. They include, Peter, Bartholomew, Simon, Jude, Paul and others. Others were scattered abroad. Among them were James (son of Zebedee) in Spain, Philip in Turkey, Matthew in Salerno, Italy, Thomas in India, John in Ephesus (Turkey) and Matthias in Germany. They indeed went into all the world as best they could. Of Jesus' original twelve apostles, only Judas is buried near Jerusalem and we know how that happened.

Still, as they spread the word of God around the world many of those who came to believe must have been expected to continue to take the message of the gospel to those in the local area. They were obeying the great commission when it says to "go" but they went into their communities, neighborhoods and families to make disciples.

So, its not either-or, it is both-and. Some are called to go to far away places and serve people in Jesus' name while teaching and preaching the gospel. While others are called to do the same things around where they live. Either way, we are all called to go. I believe that the way to look at the command is "as you go..". In other words, as you go about life and interact with people, be looking for ways to love them like Jesus, to serve them in the name of Jesus and to tell them about Jesus. Jesus never told anyone to "bring." That is "bring people to church so they will hear about Jesus there," or "bring them to you preacher/minister/pastor so he can tell them about Jesus," or "bring them to camp so they hear about Jesus." Not that it is ever bad to take a friend to church or to meet your minister or elder, or to take them with you to camp. Just remember that you have the relationship with them so you tell them about Jesus. You take responsibility for loving them, teaching them, and leading them to Jesus. You be the one who disciples them and teaches them to disciple others. If you don't know how, talk to a minister or elder at West Side and have them teach you.

"Go" doesn't mean just invite them to stuff and hope they catch on. It means you get involved, build relationships, do life together and show them what it looks like to be a disciple who makes disciples. As I understand it, "go and make disciples" is an 'all hands on deck' task that is the mission on which Christ sent all of us. "Go" means me and "go" means you!
