When God Tells You His Name

Consider the letters A, H, O, P, and R. Do those mean anything to you? I'm glad they didn't start with IHOP or I might have lost some of you. What if I rearrange the letters to this configuration: OPRAH. Does that change things for you? How about if I change it to HARPO? What are you thinking now? Some of you are thinking Harpo Marx of the Marx brothers and some may recognize that as the name of Oprah's production company. It is her name spelled backwards (mine would be MIT or YHTOMIT, but I think I would just go with MIT for those of you who are curious. I think ERONEL would approve). Silliness aside, there is a lot in a name. From meaningless letters to a storehouse of memories, perceptions, opinions and impressions. Take Oprah as an example. No two of us would share the same perspective of her. Some would first remember her long running daytime television show. Others would remember her playing starring roles in movies like "The Color Purple." Still others would remember her as being outspoken on her political views with which you may agree or disagree. Isn't it interesting that five letters, arranged just so, evoke so much response?

How about these letters: YHWH? Known in Greek as the "tetragrammaton," those four letters represent the name by which the Israelites knew their God. Often translated "the Lord," it is most like the name God gave Moses at the burning bush encounter. When Moses asked who he should say had sent him to visit Pharaoh, God told Moses his name: YHWH (or with vowels added for pronunciation: Yahweh). It sounds like the Hebrew for "I am." God's name here given evokes the qualities of permanence, timelessness, and the ultimate existence. It also speaks to his pre-eminence among the gods and his sovereignty over all that was, all that is and all that ever will be.

In a later encounter on Mount Sinai (Exodus 34:5-7), God again told Moses His name but then added more descriptors. As God passed by Moses, he said his name (translated "the Lord" in our English Bibles) but added, "the compassionate and gracious God, slow to anger, abounding in love and faithfulness, maintaining love to thousands and forgiving wickedness, rebellion and sin. Yet he does not leave the guilty unpunished; he punishes the children and their children for the sin of the fathers to the third and fourth generation." Not surprisingly God's descriptions could be summed up with two words: mercy and justice. God's name reflects His identity; shows us His heart. He is a loving God full of mercy and grace but He will also hold people accountable for their actions and will respond with consequences to the unrepentant.

One thing is for sure, God's name will not be ignored. Everyone must respond in some way. Everyone must choose to respond by either accepting His offer of love and forgiveness and be transformed into the image of His son Jesus or they can choose to reject it. When God tells you His name, eternity rests on your response.
