Discipling in Troubled Times

This article was written by Clay Reed. It was in the bulletin a few weeks ago but we are running it again in his honor. Precious words from a precious brother.

Pandemic, social unrest, hatred, racism, fear, mistrust, isolation. These are troubled times we live in. In many ways, unprecedented for our generation. With all that is going on, how then can I "Go and make disciples of all the nations...?" (Mt. 28:19) I am pretty sure the apostles thought the same thing! What a formidable task to contemplate. Indeed, an impossible task without God's help.

I don't know about you, but I tend to over-think, and over-complicate things. I want to know all possible outcomes, and contingencies if something doesn't go right, etc. I also tend to make the task bigger than it really is. For instance, in the passage above, my mind goes to the phrase, "all the nations" rather than "go and make disciples". As a result, I am defeated before I start because the job is just too big for me! In other words, I am relying on myself to get the job done. That's not going to work when it comes to making disciples.

But God has a way of simplifying things for us if we will listen. Jesus took the entire Law of Moses and boiled it down to 2 things. "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and all your mind. This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it, love your neighbor as yourself. All the Law and the Prophets hang on these 2 commandments." (MT. 22: 37-40) In other words, if you get these 2 things right, everything else falls into place.

In Luke 10, an expert in religious law was testing Jesus when he asked, "And who is my neighbor?" (In other words, "Who do I have to love?"). Jesus answered him with the parable of the Good Samaritan. The bottom line of the parable is that a neighbor is one who shows mercy to another regardless of religious or ethnic background.

After all these years of reading this passage, it finally dawned on me. This same principle applies to making disciples! Love God and love my neighbor as myself. And my "neighbor" is just the next person God puts in my path. Doesn't matter if they are black, white, brown, yellow, Republican, Democrat, rich or poor. So all the troubles fall by the way.

We just share the love that God has for that person. The love that sent Christ to die for them and then to defeat death for them. We disciple one person at a time with God's love and let God provide the results. An impossible task made possible with God's help.
