**Overcome Evil with Good**

"Do not repay anyone evil for evil. Be careful to do what is right in the eyes of everybody. If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with everyone. Do not take revenge, my friends, but leave room for God's wrath, for it is written: "It is mine to avenge; I will repay," says the Lord.

On the contrary; "If your enemy is hungry, feed him; if he is thirsty, give him something to drink. In doing this, you will heap burning coals on his head." Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good." (Romans 12:17-21 NIV)

There are many challenging passages in the New Testament. Some are challenging in terms of theology. Some are difficult to interpret. Many are challenging in application. The above scripture is among the latter. Many have undertaken to memorize part or all of this passage. Memorizing it is a piece of cake compared to applying it to life.

When someone hurts me or others for whom I care, I want to hurt them, period. It is the fleshly side of me and opposed to everything to which God calls me but the desire is still there. I doubt that I am alone.

When Saul of Tarsus went on his campaign of terror against Christians, people, understandably, scattered in fear. Even after his conversion, Jesus followers were afraid to be around him. I get it, fear is a powerful motivator but if fear had won the day, people would have missed the movement of God in Saul's life.

Later in Paul's life, he and Barnabas had a falling out over John Mark. Both men were pillars in the early church and specifically the church at Antioch. Yet later, Paul speaks of both men glowingly. Apparently in the first century, they put unity with other Christians before differences in opinion. Their differences would not be a cause for division.

Several times we see this scripture applied at heartbreaking times. When Jesus asked that God not hold his murderer against those who had perpetrated it because they "did not know what they were doing." Stephen prayed the same over his murderers as the stones were pummeling his body.

Do not repay evil for evil.

Live at peace with everyone (as far as it depends on you).

If your enemy is hungry or thirsty, feed him and give him a drink.  
 Overcome evil with good.

Be kind to people; even the people who hurt you. You never know what God is doing in someone's life. Do not let bitterness and resentment cause you to miss the amazing glory of God. Let God have the final say. Someone who has been cruel to you may have a "Road to Damascus" experience waiting just ahead and turn your persecutor in to an important and gifted ally.
