Early Challenges to Unity

I'm excited that we have begun talking about unity. I have for some time been concerned that we do not put the same emphasis and priority on unity that Jesus did. I see notes in commentaries and mentions in articles and blog posts that confess the fact that the current walled off denominational structure of Christendom is not what Jesus intended but I see little in terms of discussion around what to do about it. In my view, if unity is wanted badly enough, Jesus followers will begin to move towards it. It will not begin by addressing doctrinal or practical differences between groups. It will begin only by addressing attitudes and paradigms about the people in other groups.

In the New Testament, the problem of fair distribution of food to the widows sparked the first action taken by the apostles to head off a potentially divisive issue. The complaint was that the Greek speaking widows were being overlooked in the distribution of food. The church had undertaken the work of helping the helpless. Widows in that day who either had no family or no family willing to help them were particularly vulnerable. It seems that some suspected that the widows who were from the area around Jerusalem who spoke Aramaic received favored treatment as opposed to those who were from outside of Palestine and spoke Greek. The latter were not foreigners but they were not locals either. These ethnic sub-groups represented potential lines of division. The apostles had no intention of allowing division to enter the fellowship of Jesus' disciples and they came up with a plan.

Their plan involved choosing seven men from among the Greek speaking Jews to be in charge of the distribution of food. They allowed the minority group to have authority over the whole process. It was a brilliant solution and apparently worked very well. However, it would not surprise me if the apostles got push back from the Judean Jews for handing the whole process over to a committee with minority roots. The assumption might have been that minority interests will get favored status and the Judean widows will get passed over. It is an understandable concern unless those on the committee were working under the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

Their solution demonstrates how important it is to prioritize love and unity over majority wishes. When the majority in a community, group or organization consistently gets their way, the group will become increasingly homogenous. Conflict will escalate as the dissatisfaction grows among minority participants who feel their voice has gone unheard. Unity among all sub-groups requires love and relationships that move beyond the potential barriers. It requires group members to be willing to be flexible about getting their way and at times deferring to the goal of allowing diversity to build within the group and unity in love to be the overriding principle.

As the church, we will not be able to accomplish the mission of taking the God's kingdom to the world if the majority pattern for doctrine and practice receives priority over unity and diversity. The love that Christ requires (John 13) compels us to hold lightly our paradigm for doctrine and practice but hold firmly the mandate of love and unity. We may not understand all of scripture just the way it was intended but we can understand this: when Christ was asked to boil all of scripture down to its foundational principles, he narrowed it to two things. Love God. Love Others.
