Let's say that the speed it was traveling was 5 miles per hour through the air. That means if it could have stayed aloft for an hour, it would travel five miles in that amount of time. That however is an illusion. It is not real. In truth it was going much faster and traveled much farther. That truth is based in the fact that the earth is spinning at around 1,000 miles per hour and traveling through space at some 67,000 miles per hour. That doesn't take into account the fact that our solar system is moving as well as the galaxy and perhaps the universe. With all of that movement, my paper airplane already traveled at an incredible rate of speed before it left my hand. That is rather mind blowing.

Are you ready for more? Well, let's say Josh was in his office with his door shut when I launched the airplane. The airplane was less than ten feet from him but he never saw it because of the barriers around him. If it had made a spectacular journey (it did not) he would have missed it! In fact, I could be building a paper airplane that is a scale model of an F-35 Lightning II Navy fighter and he would never know it. (I have no idea how to do that but it would be cool.) Due to only a few thin sheets of drywall, Josh and I can be unaware of what the other is doing or even if the other is in the building. Just to see him, I have to walk 15 feet down the hall, turn a corner and go through a doorway. Its kind of a bummer because I like Josh.

It's even worse that my wife, while working, is a couple of miles away. My parents and my brothers are a couple of hundred miles away and my son is around 350 miles away. Unfortunately, to cover that space, it takes time. Traveling at speeds available to me, I need around 6 hours to get to a place where I can see my son (unless of course I could hitch a ride with an F-35 Lightning II pilot. He/she could get me there in about 20 minutes). I really don't like that.

Space costs you time and time costs you space. Defying either of them costs resources. The more efficiently you defy them, the more the cost (an F-35 Lightning II fighter costs around \$100 million dollars). In other words, there is really not much we can do about the fact that while we are earth and flesh bound, we are stuck with those dimensions. Yet something deep within us yearns to escape them. We fantasize about instantaneous travel to distant places (like the transporter in Star Trek). We fantasize about time travel (Back to the Future) and about superpowers like invisibility, seeing/moving through walls, or reading the thoughts of others. All of them imaginations about escaping the confines of time and space.

Why do we do that? In Ecclesiastes, Solomon writes, "He (God) has also set eternity in the hearts of men; yet they cannot fathom what God has done from beginning to end," (3:11). Our existence here is shrouded by mystery and illusion. We are built with the vague awareness that there is more than the confines of this life. We are also vaguely aware that one day those confines will be lifted and that will be freedom indeed. One day the illusion will be lifted and we will see all things clearly.

Until that time remember: you don't see things as they really are.
