MAKE AMERICA GREAT AGAIN

You may not recognize the name Alexis de Tocqueville, but you may recognize these words that are attributed to him. "America is great because America is good and if America ceases to be good, she will also cease to be great." Those words were actually a summation of de Tocqueville's writings by another author whose name has been lost but they are an accurate summation of his observations from a visit he made to America in the early 19th century. De Tocqueville was a French diplomat and sought direction for his country as they struggled to reunify after the peasant revolt against the monarchy. As his country floundered amidst continued violence and unrest he sought to find what it was that made America the peaceful democracy it was known to be at the time. He visited America in 1831, charged by the French government to study the prison and penitentiary system in the country. What he noticed was the sharp contrast between the unrest in Europe and the relative peace in America. He attributed the peace in America largely to the focus on religion and the teachings of Christianity adhered to by a significant percentage of Americans. As citizens held to the teachings of their faith, people could govern themselves without spiraling into the chaos of selfishness and political turf wars. De Tocqueville returned to France to write his most famous book, "Democracy in America." In it he mentions the central role of religion in American life and government. The quote above is a summation of his observations and the report he penned as a result.

It is interesting that the theme of a recent political campaign was "Make America Great Again," and the theme was invoked without much of a reference to the role of religion in American life at all. According to de Tocqueville and others, what made America great in the beginning was something that political parties in modern times are quick to push to the margins or exclude all together. What made America great was a common faith in Jesus Christ. It is what made us good and when we ceased to be good, we ceased to be great.

If we really want to make America great again it will require a movement. We need another "Great Awakening" kind of event; one where the Holy Spirit moves in the hearts of men in overtly obvious ways, convicting men of sin and driving them to repentance. If we are to be great, we must first be good. We can only be good by embracing faith and walking in the guidance of the Spirit of God within us. 'Making America Great Again' will require people of God living out their faith and embracing the themes of scripture. Themes like, gentleness, kindness, non-retaliation, sincere love even for enemies, compassion for the poor and weak, mercy for the doers of wrong, and selflessness can be contagious if consistently lived out by a mere handful of the faithful. We must strive to live that kind of life before a watching world and pray that God will direct His spirit to move making men good and our nation great again.
