Justice vs. Compassion

"Does God pervert justice?"

"Does the Almighty pervert what is right?" (Job 8:3)

There has been a lot of buzz in the news lately about the immigration issue. Many are heart-broken as they hear stories of children being taken from their parents and placed into temporary shelters while their parents go to detention centers. It is hard to see that action as anything short of horrific, yet the issue is clearly more complicated than just letting them alone.

The other side of the issue has to do with law. When someone breaks the law, they should get what is coming to them. Do the crime, do the time, right? Cross the border illegally and you deserve what you get. It matters not that others did the same and got away with it. You got caught, you get the consequences. Yet the issue is clouded when one ponders the humanitarian nightmare that many are merely trying to escape.

It's a classic dualism. Which do you choose? Be compassionate and allow illegal immigration to continue virtually unchecked? Or move to the side of justice and punish illegals as criminals separating families and creating a visceral public outcry in the process? I don't pretend to know all the answers to that but extreme positions on either side can cause major complications.

What about God? Is God just? Is God compassionate? The answer to both is obviously yes. He is both just and compassionate. Yet the terms in many ways are mutually opposed to each other. How can He be both? Doesn't his grace and mercy at times get taken advantage of practically enabling people to "continue in sin that grace may abound?" Doesn't His justice seem unfair sometimes such as in the case of people who live or have lived in places where they never heard of Jesus? What happens to them?

In Job's dialogue with his friends, he ponders what it would be like to take God to court. Job longed for a platform on which he could bring his case before the Almighty and prove his innocence. He would at least want to learn from God what he had done to cause God to turn against him.

Job's friends tell him it would be a useless exercise for "How then can a man be righteous before God? How can one born of woman be pure?" (Bildad - Job 25:4). Surely God would crush any who came before him in a court room. No line of reasoning could stand. There is no thought or argument of man that God has not already anticipated. God would brush such a one off as if a mosquito on a still summer evening.

God solved the problem by combining justice and compassion in one act. With the death of Jesus, He took our sins upon himself and paid our debt in full to satisfy His justice side. At the same time, in the sacrifice of Jesus we find mercy and grace in abundance and compassion beyond belief.

A lesson we might take from this is when we feel caught in the tension between justice and compassion, try self-sacrifice. It might be a painful choice but you will look like your Father in Heaven.
