Arkansas Foster Care Crisis

Today in Arkansas there are 4,968 children in foster care. There are 1,503 foster homes with 3,299 beds available in those homes. If you do the math, you will realize that means there are 1,669 children without homes. These children are in group homes, shelters, or in some cases sleeping on DCFS office floors for the night. Every year in Arkansas 7,000 children spend time in foster care. These children have been removed from their families due to abuse, neglect, or other problems that are putting a child in danger. These children range from infancy to 18 years old. Every year about 250 of these teenagers "age out" of the foster system without a permanent family connection.

Kids in foster care are not the government's kids; they are God's kids and therefore they are our responsibility as a church to love and protect. It is a gospel issue first and not a government issue. The church has the responsibility to speak and stand up for these children who cannot speak and stand for themselves and that is what God has done for us by giving Jesus as our savior.

In 2015, Asa Hutchinson asked for help from the faith based community to expand their ministries and seek greater involvement in the state's foster care system. Our Arkansas children deserve better and it is our responsibility to step up and love these children through the hardest times of their lives. In 2014, only 18 percent of children who had been in foster care for more than two years had lived in two or fewer homes. This means these children are often bounced around and given no stability because of the lack of available homes.

Maybe your family is not called to be a foster family, but what about to adopt? There are currently over 600 children that do not have a forever family. The average age of a child waiting to be adopted is 8 years old. There is no cost to adopt a child through DCFS. The only cost may be minimal court costs and the cost of a birth certificate. Visit theprojectzero.com to put faces to these children who are waiting for a family.

Not everyone is called to be a foster parent. As a matter of fact, most people in the Church will not bring a child into their home for any extended period of time. This does not mean the Church as a whole doesn't play an essential and necessary role in the lives of these foster families and the children they are giving their lives over to.

We are not all called to do the same thing, but we can certainly do something to create a community for these kids to grow and thrive in. You are either called to bring these beautiful children into your home or you're capable of serving and supporting those who do. These kids are God's kids and therefore they are our kids because God has adopted us as his children.

Next Sunday evening we will have a service night centered around foster care. Please come and learn how you can become a foster parent or ways you can support foster families in your area. We will be doing a service project along with an informational meeting. Please see the bulletin next week for another article on how you can help and serve these children who need and deserve our care.
